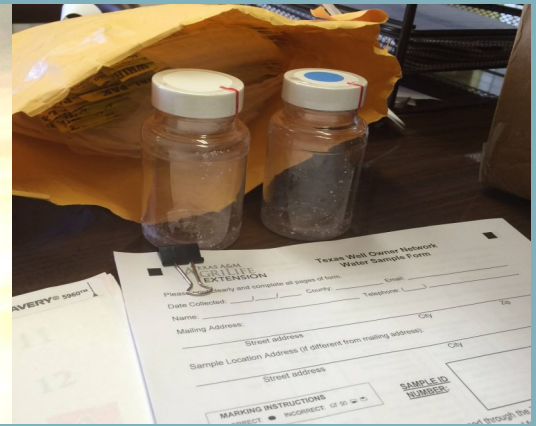

### TEXAS WELL OWNER NETWORK PROGRAM

The Texas Well Owner Network (TWON) program is a free, educational training for Texas residents who depend on household wells for their water needs. TWON is for private well owners who want to become familiar with groundwater resources, septic system maintenance, well maintenance, water quality and water treatment. Private well owners are independently responsible for monitoring the quality of their wells. Essentially, they are the operators of their own water system and are responsible for ensuring that their water is safe.

### BRING YOUR WELL WATER SAMPLES!

Well owners should bring water samples Wednesday, October 11 to be screened for nitrate-nitrogen, total dissolved solids (TDS) and *E. coli* bacteria. Pick up approved sample containers with instructions at your local County AgriLife Extension office, Brewster Extension, 2101 FM 1703 in Alpine, Culberson Extension, 300 La Caverna St. in Van Horn, Presidio Extension, 300 N. Highland in Marfa, Terrell Extension, Courthouse in Sanderson, Brewster GCD Office, 201 W. Ave. E in Alpine, Culberson GCD, 1300 W. Broadway in Van Horn, Presidio GCD, Courthouse 2nd Floor in Marfa, or Jeff Davis UWCD, 113 State St. in Fort Davis.

**Drop samples at the same location where testing materials were picked up.**

Samples are due on Wednesday, October 11 by 10:00 a.m.  
There is a \$15 per sample cost for this screening.
